Illinois Mental Health Code

405 ILCS 5/3-606

A peace officer may take a person into custody and transport him to a mental health facility when the peace officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the person is subject to involuntary admission and in need of immediate hospitalization to protect such person or others from physical harm. Upon arrival at the facility, the peace officer may complete the petition under Section 3-601. If the petition is not completed by the peace officer transporting the person, the transporting officer's name, badge number, and employer shall be included in the petition as a potential witness as provided in Section 3-601 of this Chapter.

POINTS TO CONSIDER WHEN MENTAL HEALTH INTERVENTION IS NEEDED

- The legal system can be a format to stability and obtaining help.
- Mental Illness diagnosis can be taken into consideration during the legal process.
- Just because you or your loved one has mental illness does not mean fewer rights in the legal system.
- The single most effective effort is to develop a strong support system of legal and clinical services.
- Build the proper treatment plan and team.
- Coordinate all the services together.
- Advocate for yourself as well as your loved one.
- Get support for yourself as well as your loved one.
- Expand your knowledge of available mental illness resources and useful strategies. Use the resources listed in this guide for consultation and direction.
- In order to meet involuntary hospitalization standards under the Mental Health Code, a person must be a danger to him/herself or others.
- Involuntary hospitalization can also be based on a person's inability to care for him/herself.
- **IN AN EMERGENCY, CALL 911.**

INTERVENTIONS RESULTING IN ARREST OR DETENTION

Upon arrest, alternative programs may be available. You have a right to seek assistance.

SENIORS AND ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES

If you, a family member, or a friend are a **victim of a crime**, AND are a senior 60 years or older, or an adult between 18 and 59 years of age with a disability, **FIRST** call the local police department to report the crime. **NEXT**, if you believe the victim was specifically targeted because of senior age or disability also contact the **Kane County State's Attorney Senior and Disabled Advocates** at **630-208-5324** for further assistance.

If you suspect that a senior or disabled adult is being **abused or neglected**, **FIRST** call the **Illinois Department of Human Services Office of Inspector General** at **1-800-368-1463**. **NEXT**, call the **Kane County State's Attorney Senior and Disabled Advocates** at **630-208-5324** for further assistance.
